

Editorial

The *2020 Conference on Engineering and Architecture Design Education* (EADE-2020) has been organised under the patronage of the Faculty of Architecture, Gdańsk University of Technology (FA-GUT), Gdańsk, Poland, in collaboration with: the Faculty of Architecture at Slovak University of Technology in Bratislava (FA-SUT), Bratislava, Slovakia; the Faculty of Architecture at Cracow University of Technology (FA-CUT), Kraków, Poland; and the World Institute for Engineering and Technology Education (WIETE), Melbourne, Australia.

The Conference was originally planned to be carried out in five days, between 15 and 19 June 2020. But because of the coronavirus spreading over the world and the inability to travel internationally, the host Faculty decided to carry out the Conference over the Internet in three days, between 16 and 18 June 2020.
